

Activity: Thinking about bias

Pathway:	Speech to Inform
Assessment	Section 2: Reviewing a Newspaper Item
Section:	
Activity aim:	This activity is designed to develop students' understanding of bias in news
	reports, and to show how bias can be demonstrated in different ways.
Time:	30 minutes: 20 minutes planning time, 10 minutes rehearsing
Delivery:	In small groups, give students a well-known fairy tale or nursery rhyme such as: The Three Little Pigs; Jack and Jill; Cinderella; or Humpty Dumpty.
	In their groups, students will produce a 2-minute TV news report with a clear bias. They have artistic licence to adapt the story, but they cannot fundamentally change the structure or plot. Their TV news reports should contain:
	An on-the-scene reporter
	A studio anchor
	Interviews with witnesses
	'Experts' in the studio.
	In devising their biased TV news report, groups will need to consider:
	 Selection / omission of part(s) of the story
	Word choice and tone
	 Use of names / titles ('expert' etc)
	Use of statistics
	Use of errors / assumptions
	Emphasis of parts of the story that support a certain view / stance
	 Suggesting / condemning a course of action
	Groups will present their TV news report to the rest of the class, who will be asked to identify the bias.
