

Activity: Create a story!

Pathway:	Speech to Perform
Assessment Section:	Section 3: Performing a Self-Composition
Activity Aim:	This activity promotes both group work and creativity. It gets students thinking in a fun way about the themes of 'belonging' and 'identity', and how they can be shaped into narrative.
Time:	15-20 minutes.
Delivery:	<p>In groups of three/four students, use ONE (1) of the story starters below to develop an improvised story. There are no rigid rules about the story, but it must include everyone, contain dialogue, and should last between 3-4 minutes.
