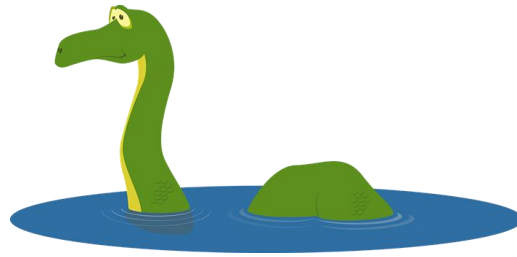

The first time anyone saw Nessie was in 1933. A new road opened along the side of the lake. In April, Mr and Mrs Mackay drove along this new road. They were **amazed** to see the water moving in the centre of the lake. They saw “an enormous animal swimming around”. The news of this monster, “Nessie”, quickly travelled around the world.

Then George Spicer reported seeing Nessie on July 22 1933. Mr George Spicer and his wife saw ‘a most extraordinary animal’ cross the road in front of their car. **They** said it had a large body with a long, narrow neck. It moved across the road towards the lake, breaking trees on the way.

On 5 January 1934, a motorcyclist called Arthur Grant said he nearly hit the creature at about 12 o’clock at night. The creature saw him and crossed the road back into the lake. Grant followed it to the lake, but only saw the water moving.

Some people believe Nessie is real and others think it’s a trick. Scientists have many explanations but people like to believe in Nessie. What do you think?
