Graded Examinations in Speech

Pre-Entry | Entry Level | Level 1 (EYFS, KS1, KS2)

ESB's Graded Examinations in Speech are designed to help learners improve their speaking, reading, listening and responding skills through a range of assessment activities. The assessments aim to boost learners' confidence in using their voice effectively and are all about showcasing learners' unique personalities and interests.

Here are a sample of these activities from across our qualification range for Primary level. Please see our specifications for more detail.

Section 1: Talk

- **Pre-Entry Level**: Something Special learners bring in and show listeners a favourite toy or item and tell them about it.
- Entry Level 3: Explaining How learners talk about something they have achieved, made, grown or learned about. They should support their talk by using a relevant visual aid.

Section 2: Speaking by heart

- **Entry Level**: Learners begin by giving the title of their chosen poem, the poet's name, and why they like it. They should then recite the poem, sharing the content with the group and the assessor.
- Level 1 (Grade 1): Learners begin by introducing their choice of poem or piece of drama, explaining what it means to them. They then present their memorised piece, sharing the content with the group and the assessor.

Section 3: Reading aloud

- **Pre-Entry Level**: Learners begin by saying the title of their chosen book and the author's name. They should then read a prepared passage of approximately 100 words from this story.
- Entry Level 2: Learners should prepare 4-5 pages (containing dialogue) of a book, from which the assessor will choose an extract to be read aloud. They must also introduce the book, stating which character they would like to talk about.

Section 4: Listening and responding

Learners answer questions from the group and the assessor after each section. They should also participate in group discussions, adding comments and questions.

Group Speaking

Entry 2 | Entry 3 | Level 1 (KS1 & 2)

Through the completion of our Group Speaking qualifications, your learners will develop their skills in speaking and listening, teamwork, and literacy.

Predominantly aimed at Key Stages 1-3, your learners will work together to: Speak from Memory; Tell a Story; and Listen and Respond. Group Speaking encourages learners to work collaboratively and support one another, cultivating a culture of co-operation and empathy.

These qualifications provide a great starting point for learners who may need to build confidence and take the first steps on their oracy journey.

Debating Level 1

(KS2 - Year 6-8)

ESB's Debating qualifications are designed to give young people an opportunity to improve their debating skills and endorse their talent for public speaking.

ESB believes that debating is an essential life skill and an aid to develop employability skills such as critical thinking, teamwork and leadership. Our suite of debating qualifications helps learners to build and deliver arguments, manage timing, and signpost and link work.

Graded Examinations in Speech for Learners with English as an Additional Language (EAL)

A1 | A2 | B1 (KS1, KS2)

Designed for learners who speak English as an additional language, ESB's Graded Examinations in Speech (EAL) qualifications enable individuals to flourish in their ability to communicate with confidence. Mapped to the National Curriculum in England in relation to its requirements in Spoken Language and Reading at Key Stages 1 and 2, these qualifications help learners to feel that their voice is important, and to enjoy speaking with and in front of others.

Our Senior & Sixth Form portfolio

Learners achieve an accredited certificate highlighting their achievement and can gain UCAS tariff points for UK university entry at Level 3.

Graded Examinations in Speech

Level 1 | Level 2 | Level 3 (KS3, KS4, KS5)

ESB's Graded Examinations in Speech are designed to help learners improve their speaking, reading, listening and responding skills through a range of assessment activities. The assessments aim to boost learners' confidence in using their voice effectively and are all about showcasing learners' unique personalities and interests.

Speech to Inform

This qualification motivates learners to delve deeper into a particular topic of the curriculum. They are encouraged to give a personal interest talk, review a news piece and give a persuasive speech about current affairs that can be political, social, economic or environmental in scope.

Speech to Connect

This Pathway enables learners to not only improve their speaking and listening skills but also improve their literacy and analytical skills. Learners will deliver a biographical talk about a person of their choice, recite a poem or a piece of drama by heart, deliver a chosen reading and, in turn, respond to questions from their peers.

Speech to Perform

This qualification encourages learners to unlock their creative side with the performance of a selfcomposition (poetry, song lyrics, drama or short story), as well as a performance of an established work. This Pathway builds learners' confidence through performing.

Speech for Employability

This option supports learners who want to deepen their understanding of a particular career and build confidence in preparing themselves for the job market. They will also get the opportunity to have a one-to-one mock interview in a friendly and supportive environment.

Level 3 Certificate in Speech

Grade 6 | Grade 8 (KS5 – Year 12 & 13)

The ESB Level 3 Certificate in Speech promotes oracy and is designed to refine learners' presentational and communication skills at a mature level. Specifically, the qualification can help learners to construct and deliver original and well-evidenced arguments, interpret and critically review information, and evaluate competing ideas and perspectives in a discussion.

At Grade 6, the qualifications are split into four sections:

Presentation

- Literature Interpretation and Analysis
- Critical Review
- Questions and Discussion

At Grade 8, the qualifications include the following sections:

- Presentation
- Discussion of a News Item
- Literary Recommendation
- Ouestions and Discussion

At Level 3 (VI Form and Post 16), learners can earn up to 30 UCAS tariff points for UK university entry.

Debating

Level 1 | Level 2 | Level 3 (KS3, KS4, KS5)

ESB's Debating qualifications are designed to give young people an opportunity to improve their debating skills and endorse their talent for public speaking. ESB believes that debating is an essential life skill and an aid to develop employability skills such as critical thinking, teamwork and leadership.
