

Entry Level – 1.4 – Lesson Plan – Using Visual Aids (E1 and E2)

Lesson Objective and Assessment Criteria covered	<p>Lesson Objective: <i>To explore the best ways to use visual aids to support our talks.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Share an object, model, or game with a listening group. • Share an object, model, picture, or piece of equipment with a listening group. • Present chosen object.
Delivery	<p><i>These activities are suggested as ways to help learners to explore their chosen object, model, picture, or piece of equipment, in order to explain/describe it to an audience with more personal detail.</i></p> <p>Entry Level 1 and Entry Level 2</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Learners take their time to investigate and think in more depth about their own object. They can use the accompanying activity sheet 'EL – 1.4 – Activity – Exploring Your Object'. 2. Learners can explore their objects/images/models etc. with magnifying glasses, digital cameras or digital microscopes. 3. Learners draw a picture of their object, finding the individuality in it: the way it feels in their hands; the knocks, bumps, scratches, and individual marks that the object has, which add up and give the object additional interest and meaning. 4. Once learners have had the time to thoroughly explore their items, they discuss what they have found with their partners or groups, for example: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. 'You can see that the case is leather and although it is very hard to see, you may notice if you look very carefully, that that has actually been hand-stitched, which shows just how special an item it is.' 5. Learners can record additional details in a variety of ways in order to build an effective description, such as: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. written on paper. b. voice recorded. c. filmed by the learners. d. added onto the talk planning sheet from Lesson 1 and 2.
