1. A census is an official count of a population that takes place every few years. In this country it takes place every ten years. Census statistics show a picture of the nation and how we live. We can compare different groups of people across the United Kingdom because the same questions are asked, and the information is recorded in the same way throughout England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
2. The population of England & Wales on Census Day, 21 March 2021, was 59,597,300. Since 1801, the census has collected and shared facts about our population and its characteristics. It helps to develop policies and plan and distribute financial support. Many events have happened since 1801 as there have been wars, many kings, queens and leaders and considerable developments in industry, technology and culture.
3. Everyone uses public services such as schools, health services, roads and libraries. These services need to be planned so that they are up to date with fast-changing patterns of modern life. We need accurate information on the numbers of people, including the balance of young and old, what jobs people do, where they live and in what type of houses. When the population is counted in each area, it helps the government to work out the amount of money it will give to each local council and each health service. Before central or local government can offer services, policies must be based on high quality **evidence**.

Task 3

THE VALUE OF THE COCONUT

- 1 The coconut belongs to the Palm tree family. Large numbers are grown in many tropical countries. They are often seen as a fruit and frequently confused with being a nut, but they are a 'drupe'. Drupes include peaches and cherries. In the Sanskrit language in India, the coconut tree is known as kalpa vriksha - '**a tree which gives all that is necessary for living**' because nearly all parts can be used: the water, milk, the tissue inside (called the 'meat') and the oil. Even the outside can be used for making ropes, rugs, sacks, baskets and filling for mattresses to go on beds. Coconut palm leaves have many uses such as making brushes, baskets, rugs or they can be dried and used for roofs. Wood from the trunk of the coconut palm was traditionally used to build bridges, houses, huts and boats in the tropical countries. The wood is so straight and strong that it makes a reliable building material.

- Palm trees produce coconuts up to 13 times a year and although it takes a year for the tree to mature, it can then produce between 60-180 coconuts in a single harvest. You have to be careful when collecting them as they can give your head quite a bang.

- 3 **Fats and health**
- The meat of the coconut contains large amounts of fat but unlike other nuts, if it is eaten in small amounts, it seems to be good for people. Doctors say that coconut oil should not be used too much and still recommend olive oil as the best oil to use for cooking. However, if you don't want to cook with it, it is actually great for your skin. Coconut oil will take make-up off and provide a natural cream for your face.

- It is now thought that drinking coconut milk and eating other coconut foods may help protect the body from **infections** and viruses. Coconut milk is rich in vitamins and good for your body. Ideally it should be drunk once or twice a week. Coconut water has flavour and is often drunk as a 'natural' sports drink. It has no added sugar. The white part of the coconut seed is called coconut meat. The coconut meat comes in several forms. You can get it from a fresh whole coconut or it can be dried. Coconut flour is a healthy way to add coconut flavour when baking.
